Interface Councils Candidate Pledge

Interface Councils plays an important role in the success of Victoria's economy. Home to over 1.6 million residents, the Interface Councils Region (ICR) comprises the ten councils that form an urban ring around Melbourne. As the fastest growing region in Victoria, Interface Councils is expected to grow by another 765,000 people by the end of 2031. During the past decade alone, the ICR has outpaced the rest of Melbourne in population growth. The region now accounts for 26% of Melbourne's population and 49% of Melbourne's growth during this period.

Growth has put incredible pressures on existing services and infrastructure in the region, which simply means supply is not meeting demand. Research consistently indicates that the Interface Councils lag behind the rest of Melbourne in terms of liveability, and that residents struggle to access what they need day to day.

The unique positioning of Interface Councils means that many issues that occur in the region have a direct impact on other Local Government Areas (LGAs) on their border or within close proximity. These issues include access to local jobs, housing, the provision of essential services and pressure on local infrastructure such as roads and public transport.

It is important following the Victorian Election that all parliamentarians make a concentrated effort to ensure key investments for infrastructure and services that will improve the quality of people's lives and ensure that Melbourne's outer communities do not fall further behind.
